President's Report

Hello everyone,

Firstly, I would like to congratulate and thank Darren Scott for his term as Club President. Darren is a VSDCA and Coburg CC icon and we've been very fortunate to have him lead this club for the past six seasons – thank you so much "Scotty", you are a true Coburg club person.

My first season as club President has been a difficult one, full of many challenges, but just as in life, we have to face and overcome them no matter how daunting they may be.

One of our most serious challenges was that we lost a number of senior players who decided to play elsewhere, some to hopefully challenge themselves at a higher level.

Senior Men

The club administration, in conjunction with senior Coach Pranish Singh, sought to fill the void left by the player departures which resulted in the club eventually being able to fill 5 XI's each week which was an astounding effort.

Part of this effort was the recruitment of four young Englishmen to play in our 1st XI. This is a common practice amongst senior cricket at this level and one which we felt was imperative to strengthen our 1st XI.

Noah Thain, Sidney Thomson, Cameron Harding & Osian Catlin joined us from the "Old Dart" and from their first day at the club they proved to be great people and fantastic attributes to our club both on and off the field.

Congratulations to Noah who had an outstanding season scoring 555 runs @ 50.45 including 179 & 136 and was involved in a record first wicket partnership of 230 in a one-day match with Cam Harding who also scored 120. Their prowess on the field was only surpassed by their contribution in the club social scene.

<u>Success</u>

Congratulations must be extended to 4th XI Captain, Zac Lassey who, with mentor Brian Lassey, led the 4th XI to a gallant premiership over local rival Strathmore and they did it the hard way. With Merri-bek Council refusing to let the 4ths play their Grand Final at City Oval they had to win it at the opposition's ground and did so with a very young side. A wonderful effort which was complimented by Zac being presented with the Daryl Thiele medal for the best player in the VSDCA 4th XI, at the Sub-District presentation night held at the MCG. A great achievement by Zac after being runner-up in the same award last season.

The 5th XI, under the leadership of Richard Giordano, although populated mainly with kids, only just missed out on finals. A wonderful effort, many thanks Richard for your commitment to the team and to ensure the kids were provided with their opportunities.

Senior Ladies

Under the guidance of Tracey (Hammo) Gleeson we started the season with two teams however, whilst the 1st XI made the finals with some stirring performances, numbers began to drop off after Christmas to the extent that the 2nds had to forfeit some games. The club must double its efforts to reinvigorate the numbers involved.

Secretary's Report

I look back on Season 2024/25 with mixed emotions. There were some big positives that I will touch on, but the club faced some massive challenges, for our Men in particular. Losing 29 players from our male playing group was a massive set back. Replacing so many players, many of them 1st & 2nd XI players was a daunting task. Credit must go to our Men's Coach Pranish Singh and his assistants Hamza Ali & Hammad Siddiqui on replacing those players and ensuring the club could field 5 competitive teams each weekend. These three gentlemen will not be returning in 2025/26. I thank them all for their efforts and wish them all the best for the future.

The continuing battle to access to City Oval for games at the start and end of each season is nothing new, but it again reared its head at the conclusion of the season. Whilst it is almost a foregone conclusion that we do not play the first 2 weeks of the season at home, there is still hope that we can play finals there in March. It was very disappointing to have to fight with council to get access for our 4th XI Semi-Final after we finished top of the ladder, and it was no surprise that we were not given permission to host the Grand Final.

It was apparent that council were looking after the ground for the start of the football season, watering the ground on Saturday mornings and replacing an old pitch with a sod next to the Semi Final pitch the week of the Semi Final. It is frustrating that this keeps happening. There is light at the end of the tunnel though. Council have announced that they will be resurfacing the entire playing surface with a more suitable grass this October. It means that our season will be interrupted but the expectation is that the ground will be much more resilient. It will bounce back quicker after football and will hold up much better in the heat of summer. Fingers crossed.

Our women are also battling with the changing landscape of women's community cricket. More and more of our younger players are being approached by Premier clubs every year and the WCCC has shrunk over those past few years with clubs choosing to join local competitions, rather than playing in the Melbourne wide competition. Sadly, CV have announced that 2025/26 will be the last season they run the WCCC with clubs being told they will need to look for a new home next season.

It is not all bad news, however. Our 4th XI won our first Men's flag in over 10 years with our captain Zac Lassey winning the comp medal for the best player of the season.

One positive with having so many players leave, is that there are more opportunities for players. This year we had a record number of 1st XI debutants including Harry Marr who became the first Coburg player to begin in our blaster program and progress to our 1st XI. Great work Harry. We also had a record number of our Juniors play seniors this year across all grades with 11 boys representing our seniors.

The huge turnover also opened up the doors to overseas players and we had 4 join us for the summer. Sid, Osh, Cam, and Noah were part of the furniture this summer, contributing to the club both on and off the field. Cam and Noah combined for the highest club 1st XI partnership, missing the club record by a hand full of runs vs Endeavour Hills. Both boys made centuries as we made our highest ever one day score. 3 weeks later, the boys led by Noah who made another massive ton, broke our record for the highest two-day score by Coburg.

Our lady's 1st XI had a successful year making the Semi-Final but did not progress unfortunately. Sadly, we had to pull our 2nd XI with injuries and unavailable players forcing to many forfeits to continue.

With 11 Junior players playing seniors, it should not come as a shock that our under 16 boys were competitive. They were minor champions and also reached a Semi, however they fell just short in an epic run chase.

While none of the other Junior teams dominated their grades, there were plenty of performances that give hope for the future. Our junior program is the most important and exciting aspect of our Club. It continues to grow from strength to strength with countless wonderful passionate players and parents involved. Our coaches do a remarkable job with Wednesday night being a buzz every week and players enjoying their cricket. Bill Tucknott our Junior Coordinator does a mountain of work and should be very proud of what our club is building.

The Committee continue to do great job running our club every year and I am extremely proud of the work they put in. The dedication of volunteers who make our club a better place for all cannot be underestimated. Thank you. Our social media team, as an extension of our committee are some of the best in the business. Kyra and Lasharne Wallace put in a huge amount of work promoting all areas of our club, making my job so much easier and I cannot thank them enough.

One of the highlights of my week is the hour or two I spend with my fellow exec members on a Saturday Morning setting up our grounds. A job that can quite frankly be a chore, is a tonne of fun with the right people. Pete, Shayne and Tucky do so much for our club and could be excused for being grumpy about marking wickets. They do not complain, they do not whinge, they just turn up and hang shit on each other and have a bunch of fun in the process. This is a great example of why our club is so wonderful in my opinion – we have wonderful people who enjoy each other's company working together. These three along with our Ladies VP Liz Rowland do a mountain of work and are a major factor in why I want to continue as Secretary.

I will finish off by thanking my family. My wife and my two sons tolerate a lot and give me the support I need, so thank you.

Looking ahead to next year, we are excited to welcome Cam D'Cruz as our Men's Coach and have Tracey Gleeson continue as our Women's Coach.

Looking forward to a great season at Coburg.

George Peter Flack

The Coburg Cricket Club mourns the passing of a great club and cricket person in George Peter Flack.

Universally and affectionately known as "Flacky", Peter began his involvement with Coburg in 1968-69 after moving over from the Essendon CC with him playing his last game for the club in season 1992-93. Over those many seasons Peter scored 4901 runs @ 20.57 scoring two centuries with a highest score of 118. Bowling-wise Peter bowled 2943 overs returning 479 wickets @ 14.15 with BBF 7/37. But the list of his achievements are as amazing as lengthy. The following is a brief overview:

- Bowling average winner of various grades 9 times.
- Batting average winner of various grades 3 times.
- MCL 4th X1 player of the year 1988/89
- VSDCA 4th X1 player of the 1991/92
- Captained 3rd X1 (2 seasons), 4th X1 (6 seasons)



However, Peter's other love was his involvement in the world of junior development. In season 1985 Peter took the reins of our club u/14 "Hatch" program as coach until season 1993, during which time he won three premierships.

Peter also resurrected our club u/16 program as coach from 1984/85 to 1990/91 during which time he won two premierships whilst affording many talented juniors the opportunity to experience senior turf cricket. Whilst the cricket was one element of his junior interest, Peter's involvement extended to the development of the kids as young, growing adults.

When it came to his junior players, some viewed Peter as a disciplinarian but he was always there for them as their mentor and there are a number of his former junior players today who have grown into fine adults solely due to his efforts and guidance.

As if he wasn't involved in the club enough, Peter was also involved in the club administration, on general committee from 1970/71 – 1977/78 then, as secretary 1978/79. He was club Vice President for 13 years, (1979/80 – 1982/83 then 1984/84 to 1992/93.

In recognition of his contribution to the Coburg Cricket Club Peter was presented with Club Life Membership in 1979 and later inducted into the club Hall of Fame 2006. Inductee #9. At the "youthful" age of 74, Peter represented Australia in the over 70's cricket carnival.

For many years Peter was involved with the VSDCA administration whilst also managing the Hatch / J.G. Craig competition. In recognition of his service to VSDCA cricket, in 2023/24, Peter was deservedly rewarded by being inducted into the VSCDA Hall of Fame.

It's no secret that for 15 years Peter was battling a health issue requiring him to undergo dialysis three days per week, but he didn't let this interfere with his activities, even arranging for his dialysis when overseas for cricket displaying a level of determination and resilience rarely see in the younger generation making his achievements even more impressive.

Recognised as a fierce competitor and a Coburg CC icon, "Flacky" will never be forgotten by those whose lives he touched.

Gerald Hayes

We said goodbye to another favourite son this year in Gerald "Sticks" Hayes who suddenly passed away in February. Also known as Mullet and Haysey, Gerald joined Coburg in 1999, recruited by his friend Wayne Rowland. An imposing figure on the cricket field, Gerald opened the bowling in our 4th XI for much of the next decade taking 99 wickets @13.75 in 70 matches and playing in our 4th XI premiership in 2007.

A gentle giant, Gerald was one of the best clubmen you could ask for. Always the first to volunteer to help with any task, especially if brute strength was required! Gerald had a sharp wit and dry sense of humour, but he took as much joy in seeing a fellow club mate do well as he did in his own success, traits that endeared him all that played and trained alongside him.

After moving home to Ballarat, Gerald stayed involved with the club as a sponsor and keen past player.

A very popular player at Coburg, Gerald will be sadly missed.

Dennis Fowler Award

Dennis Fowler was an outstanding member of the Coburg Cricket Club and was one of its greatest servants. There is no doubt that its existence today is in large part due to his outstanding efforts. He was appointed to the General Committee in 1970 and served the club in that capacity until 1983 when he was elected to the position of President which he held for the next 17 years. During his reign Dennis oversaw the club participate in 21 Grand Finals for 14 Premierships. This award is given each year to an outstanding contributor to the club and is nominated by and voted on by committee members.

This season this award was won again by Peter Karvelis, a worthy winner last season and equally so again this season Peter is a ball of energy and is always doing something for the benefit of the club be it in the area of men's, women's, or Craig Shield. Well done PK.

The Arthur Marcy Award

Arthur Marcy is a Life Member of CCC and was inducted into CCC inaugural Hall of Fame in January 2006. Arthur played 296 club games and represented the First XI in 190 of these. Arthur also made an enormous contribution to CCC post his playing days including 10 years as Vice President and 5 years served as club President. The Arthur Marcy Medal is presented to the best performing player across the first four men's senior teams, as voted by the players, at the conclusion of each round.

4th XI Premiership Captain Zac Lassey took out the 2024/25 Arthur Marcy Award. Also, the recipient of the VSDCA 4th XI Player of the Year award, Zac excelled with both bat and ball scoring 166 in one game and taking 5/0 in another.

William G. Tucknott Medal

William G. Tucknott is one of six Honoured Legends of The Coburg Cricket Club. The club's games record holder and leading wicket taker, William (Bill) was instrumental in forming our Women's program in 1992 as well as our Junior Program. The William G. Tucknott Medal is awarded to the Most Valuable Women's player across all teams as voted by the Umpires and opposition Captain's at the conclusion of each round.

Eva Natsis took out this season's award after dominating with the bat all season. Eva who also won the WCCC Shield 2 Batting Award and making the team of the year had a stellar season in both Women's teams making a combined 468 runs at an average of 66.86.

Men's Senior Club Champion

All-rounder Cam Harding won this year's Men's Club Champion, accumulating the most points in 1st XI games, narrowly defeating fellow Englishman, Noah Thain. Cam was consistent with both bat and ball as well as showing a great set of hands.

Women's Senior Club Champion

By the difference of 2 runs, Lasharne Wallace was the winner of our Women's Club Champion over Club Captain, Georgia Peel. Consistent with bat, ball, and her fielding, Lasharne was a worthy winner.

Men's Junior Club Champion

Not surprisingly, Noah Thain at 19 years old and already a 1st Class County Cricketer for Essex, was the winner of the Men's Junior Club Champion for the best performed Under 21 male player.

Women's Junior Club Champion

Lasharne Wallace completed the double, also winning our Women's Junior Club Champion award for the third time.

Our Second XI was well captained by Hammad Siddiqui who produced another fine season of 20 plus wickets. Our batting failed to fire on too many occasions, but Abdul also contributed with the bat by scoring 290 runs to complete a noteworthy all-round season. Logan Valentine, Umair Farooq and Abhayvir Singh Gill also produced totals of over 240 runs.

Ashish Bhasin again stepped up to take the reins of our Third XI and did a wonderful job of marshalling the troops in an ever-changing line up. He led from the front with the ball with 26 wickets and was well supported by youngsters, Max Hart, and Ethan Patten-Cox. Club stalwart Nathan Hart again had a 300 plus runs season and received good back up from Dylan Herathge and Bailey Kennedy.

As previously mentioned, our Fourth XI completed a magnificent season by tasting premiership glory. Captain Zac Lassey's performances were recognised by the competition when he managed to win the Daryl Thiele medal for the best player in the VSDCA Fourth XI competition, but he was supported with team performances across the year. Special

mentions should be made of Patrick Lockwood and Prabhnoor Singh Boparai who both had 300+ run seasons next to Zac's 500+ runs. In the field, Hayagreev Bashyam, Christian La Porta, and Brian Lassey all chipped in with 15+ wickets. Another youngster, Luke Cameron, completed a fine season with a vital 35 in the Grand Final, which with Brian Lassey's 68no allowed us to post a defendable score of 169. After that, Hayagreev Bashyam weaved his magic to take 5/34 off 25.5 overs and the rest they say is history.

Finally, the club would like to thank our coach of the last two seasons, Pranish Singh, for his commitment and expertise across these two seasons. Pranish has overseen the development of many younger players across these 2 seasons, and this will hold the club in good stead as we move forward. Unfortunately, Hamza Ali has also indicated that he will be moving on to another club and we wish him all the best as he continues his journey across clubland. Our captains do a wonderful job across all XIs and I should also make mention of Richard Giordano who took the reins of our Sunday Fifth XI and also did a tremendous job. Thanks to all who took on the sometimes-thankless task of leadership. Your efforts do not go unnoticed.

Round 1 – Ivanhoe

Our first game, under threatening clouds, saw us win the toss and bat first.
